Harold LeRoy Jackson (age 82) Of Tyler, Washington passed away peacefully on May 23, 2016. Harold was born August 2nd, 1933 in San Luis Obispo, CA to Russell and Iva Jackson and was one of 11 children. From 1938 to 1952, the family lived in 15 cities throughout Washington before settling in the Tyler area. He went to Cheney High School through 10th grade after which he worked at Cheney Weeder making parts for combines. Surviving family includes his wife of 64 years Helen Jackson, son Mike Jackson, and daughter Tammy Shaw all of Cheney, WA. He is also survived by one sister Delores Chambliss of Nashville, Tn, nine grandchildren and twelve great-grandchildren. He is preceded in death by sons, Vernon and William Jackson, sisters Helen Velacich, Julia Watson, Martha Morey, Dorothy Abbott and brothers Arthur and Martin Jackson.
