



## Harry Roland Kincher

January 10, 1927 - January 3, 2022

Harry Roland Kincher, born January 10, 1927, entered the presence of his Lord on January 3, 2022, one week before his 95th birthday, after a brief illness. He was born in The Dalles, Oregon, and lived through high school in Redlands, Cal. After serving in the Navy in WWII, he attended Westmont College in California and Dallas Theological Seminary in Texas. His working years were spent in mission activities in the Philippines, Military bases in Europe, and the United States. He also taught in Christian schools on all levels from kindergarten to college level. In 1994 he married Gloria Loizeaux, of Spokane. He is survived by one sister, a half brother, two nieces, one nephew, his wife Gloria, and Gloria's family of seven children and spouses, 37 grandchildren and many spouses, and 106 great-grandchildren. Interment will be in Spokane, WA. A memorial service for Roland is Saturday, January 15 at 11:00 am at Evangelical Free Church of the Palouse, (4812 Airport Road, Pullman WA). A reception will follow the service. Please be praying for Gloria and the extended family as they look to God for peace and encouragement at Roland's homegoing.
