August 6, 1959 - November 17, 2018

ON SATURDAY NOVEMBER 17, 2018, JULES JEAN MAUGET, LOVING FATHER, BROTHER AND UNCLE, PASSED AWAY AT THE AGE OF 59. JULES WAS BORN ON AUGUST 8TH 1959 IN SPOKANE, WASHINGTON TO JULES AND IRENE MAUGET.
